BAROQUE ROUTE IN SANLUCAR



The period of greatest commercial boom in Sanlúcar coincided with one of the most important artistic movements in Andalusia. Baroque churches and palaces are found in much of the urban space. Places that were either designed entirely in this style or contain Baroque elements. We recommend the following route.



1. In Plaza San Francisco. San Francisco Church. Century XVIII. The old Franciscan Convent is now Colegio de La Salle. Several Passion Brotherhoods are located in the temple.



2. In San Francisco square. Parish church of San Nicolás. XVIII century. The image of the Christ of the Expiration stands out in it. Located in the surroundings of the old neighborhood of sailors.



3. In Santo Domingo street. Church of Santo Domingo. Century XVI. Renaissance style, it is one of the most outstanding monuments in Sanlúcar. In addition to other items of great interest, baroque altarpieces and paintings stand out, among them the Virgin of the Rosary called "La Galeona".



4. In San Jorge street. Church of San Jorge. XVII century. Old religious center of the English merchants neighborhood. It is currently the headquarters of the Brotherhood of Rocío de Sanlúcar.



5. In Regina street. Regina Coeli Convent. Century XVI. Mannerist style, built by the architect Alonso de Vandelvira. The Baroque images and altarpieces inside stand out. Seat of the Order of Poor Clares



6. In Virgen de Gracia y Esperanza street. San Diego Church. XVII century. Old convent of Dieguine Monks.



7. In Plaza de la Paza. Parish of Our Lady of the O. XIV century. Although its original style is Mudejar, it has staked baroque elements such as the chapel of Sacramento, the main altarpiece and images such as the Cristo de la Vera Cruz.
